Northern Peninsula Regional Service Board Welcome residents of Subregion 3

Northern Peninsula Regional Service Board has been providing waste management services in Subregion 1 & 2 since 2005. Upon continuous community consultations and working with the provincial government, on September 29, 2008 operations began in Subregion 3. (Eddies Cove East to Castor River South)

Clean up and development of the former Straits/St. Barbe Waste Disposal Site is currently underway. This site will be developed into a modern consolidated landfill site. A compactor waste disposal truck is being designed and manufactured and due to arrive by mid December.

Castor River South waste disposal site will be cleaned up and closed out in the near future. Waste has to be delivered to the former Straits Waste Disposal Site.

In the mean time, waste is been collected using a pick-up truck.

Listed below is the waste collection schedule. This schedule is subject to change upon the arrival of the new compactor truck. Residents will be notified of any change.

Half pick-up load or less \$10.00
Full Pick-up Load \$15.00
Full Pick-up Truck and Trailer \$30.00
Full Dump Truck \$50.00
Full Tractor Trailer \$150.00
NPRSB will collect business waste for \$1.50 per bag.
(For use of pick-up truck only, after 6 loads per week, no charge)

Waste Collection Regulations

- **Bag the Loose Stuff**- to prevent littering. Make sure all loose material is bagged
- All waste has to be put in **Large Garbage Bags** rather than several small bags
- Please be careful and **Double Bag** any items that can come through the bag
- **Keep it Light** each bag should be lighter than 35 lbs
- Waste has to be put near curbside by **8:00 a.m.**
- Please keep your waste bins **Clean and Tidy**
- Please **Tie your Bags** before placing them in your bins
- If you don't use a bin please **Cover Your Waste**
- There are no bag limits on waste collections

For Residents only: there is **NO CHARGE** to drop off any waste other than oil tanks or car wrecks, which will be a fee of \$10.00.

Car Wrecks: Tires must be taken off and fluids drained (motor oil, transmission fuel, antifreeze, fuel, etc.)

Oil Tanks: Drained properly and if this cannot be completed an incision must be made to make sure remaining residue is drained.

There will be absolutely **NO SCAVENGING ALLOWED**. We do allow usable wood to be taken. Scavenging will be reported and charges will be laid.

BIOMEDICAL SHARPS

No sharps (needles) are to be included with residential waste. For the safety of the Waste Collector, Landfill Attendant, equipment operators, as well as the general public, this is of the utmost importance.

For the safety of all involved please store these items in a covered container. When ready for disposal deliver the container to the landfill attendant so it can safely be disposed off. There will be no cost for this service. Thank you for your co-operation.

Finally, the Board welcomes any input as to how to improve its waste management services on the Northern Peninsula.


